Fluent in English

Clinical Activity:

The International fellow will spend 12 weeks split in two UPMC hospitals (Presbyterian and Shadyside). He/she will have the opportunity to attend and discuss all kind of open vascular and endovascular surgical procedures in all fields of vascular surgery on a daily basis. The fellow will NOT have scrubbing privileges.
